Visit our local Fairfax County public parks and nature centers. <u>Huntley Meadows</u> (3701 Lockheed Blvd, Alexandria, VA 22306) has well maintained, wooded trails and a long boardwalk over a wetland teeming with wildlife. There is also a nature center open daily (except for Tuesdays).

Attend a free event at the <u>Martha Washington Library</u> (6614 Fort Hunt Rd, Alexandria, VA 22307). Check out the <u>library calendar</u> for preschool, school age and teen events. Registration is required for some events. Call or visit the library for more information.

Participate in the <u>Fairfax County Public Library Winter Reading Program.</u> Sign up on Beanstack (after November 24) or visit your local public library branch to pick up a paper log (available Dec 1). When you complete the reading goal for your age/grade visit the library and receive prizes for finishing the program.

<u>Take a First Day Hike.</u> A family hike is the perfect way to start the new year. All Virginia State Parks celebrate the new year with free park entry and special programs. <u>Mason</u>

<u>Neck State Park</u> in Lorton has a fun collection of trails from easy to moderate. The Fairfax County Park Authority joins in the fun with a January 1st photo contest. Find more information and photo contest rules <u>online</u>.

The <u>Smithsonian Museums</u> and the <u>National Zoo</u> are free (four locations require free entry tickets or passes) and open everyday of break except December 25. The <u>National Museum</u> <u>of the United States Army</u> (in Fort Belvoir) and <u>Planet Word Museum</u> (925 13th St NW, Washington, DC 20005) are also free (both require passes, reserve online) and offer plenty of hands-on exhibits for kids.

The <u>US Botanical Garden</u> (100 Maryland Ave SW, Washington, DC 20001) is free and has an annual holiday exhibit. Explore poinsettias, model trains and DC landmarks made out of plants.
